ABSTRACT

The influence of elementary school students' maladaptation on interest in school counselors

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This study aims to develop a school maladjustment scale, to measure interest in school counselors (SC), consider the influence of school maladjustment on interest in SC, and to examine differences in scale scores according to the school year. In Study 1, a questionnaire survey was prepared based on a preliminary survey and, in this survey, a questionnaire survey was conducted for a total of 470 students from grades 3 to 6. Explorative factor analysis resulted in four factors being extracted at two levels of \langle maladaptive factors \rangle and \langle maladaptive symptoms \rangle in the school maladjustment scales, while one factor was extracted from the interest measure for SC. Next, \langle maladaptive factors \rangle influenced \langle interest in SC \rangle through \langle maladaptive signs \rangle . Furthermore, in Study 2, we examined the grade differences of these scales using a cross-sectional survey (548 students) and a longitudinal study (313 students). Consequently, attention to SC, maladaptive factors, and maladaptive signs were significantly reduced between the fifth and sixth grades in elementary schools.
